Medication

Student Dress Code

Georgia Special Needs Scholarships: SB10 and SB47

What: Under state laws passed by the Georgia State Legislature, parents of students who receive special education services or accommodations under a Section 504 Individual Accommodation Plan may request to transfer their child to another public or private school in Georgia.

Who: Any student who currently receives special education services, grades PK-11th and any returning 12th grader, as well as students who are eligible for a Section 504 Plan and are in grades Kindergarten-11th.

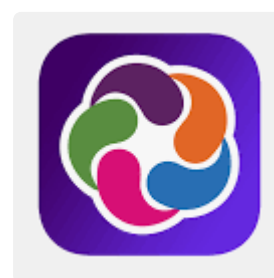

GCPS Parent Portal Transition to ParentVUE

On March 25, 2024, family accounts were moved from Parent Portal to ParentVUE. This change will require parents/guardians to reset their passwords.

The district sent out an email notification through ParentSquare on March 25th to families of active students with an email address in Synergy. The message to parents will contain a link parents should click to initiate the password change.

Gwinnett County Public Library will be hosting Vision To Learn this Summer!

In Coordination with Vision To Learn, Gwinnett County Public Library will be offering vision screenings, eye exams, and, if necessary, glasses for children. Quality vision care is an important component of education; students who cannot see often struggle to learn to read, see the board, and succeed academically. **The eye exams and eyeglasses are available free of charge to all students who need them at no out-of-pocket cost to parents or children.**



What to Expect

If your child is chosen to get an exam, they will go through a basic screening. If this screening is failed, a trained and licensed Optometrist will perform a basic eye exam and prescribe glasses if appropriate.

If follow-up care is needed, you will be informed of this. If prescription glasses are needed, your child will be given the opportunity to pick from a variety of frames and submit an order. Vision To Learn will return in 4-6 weeks once the prescription glasses are ready for pick-up. Library staff will notify you when this occurs.

If no prescription glasses or follow-up care is needed, you and your child can enter the new school year with the peace of mind that their vision is sound.

Reasons to Keep Your Child Home from School

You should keep your child at home if he/she might spread an illness to other children. Children who are sick have a difficult time participating in class and learning.

Fever Children with a temperature of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher should stay at home until there is no fever for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications. If your child returns to school with a fever, he/she could still be contagious.	COVID-19 Notify the school immediately if your child has tested positive or has been in contact with someone who has COVID-19. Follow the school's return guidance for COVID-19.	Vomiting Any child who has vomited twice in 24 hours should stay home. Your child may return to school after 24 hours of NO vomiting or fever.	Diarrhea One event of watery diarrhea is reason for your child to stay home from school. Your child may return after 24 hours of NO diarrhea. Call your child's doctor if fever, rash, dehydration, or weakness are present.
Persistent Cough If your child's cough is worse than you would expect with a cold, keep your child home from school. If he/she suddenly develops a cough, has a hard time breathing, or has a fever, call your child's doctor.	Sore throat If your child has a severe sore throat or a sore throat with a fever, headache, or stomachache, keep your child home and call your child's doctor.	Pain (ear, head, stomach) If pain disrupts your child's participation in regular activities or is accompanied by fever, nausea/vomiting, or sore throat, keep child home and call your child's doctor.	Chickenpox Your child should stay at home until all bumps are scabbed and no new bumps have shown up for two days. **Most children have received the vaccine for chickenpox (Varicella vaccine)
Pinkeye/Conjunctivitis If your child has red eye(s) with drainage that is cloudy or yellow, crusting, and/or pain, call your child's doctor. If child has bacterial conjunctivitis, he/she may return after beginning treatment.	Scabies Your child should stay home for 24 hours after treatment. Scabies is a contagious disease caused by a mite. Itching and a rash will be noted.	Head Lice Keep your child home and treat, making sure all live lice are eliminated. Nit removal will need to be done daily. Contact your school for more information. **Child cannot return to school with live lice.	Impetigo If your child has impetigo (red, oozing blister areas with yellow-gold scabs on the body or face), he/she should stay home until doctor says it's OK for child to return.

- When there is doubt in your mind about sending your child to school, consult your child's doctor.
- Make sure that your child's school knows how to reach you during the day. Remember to update your phone contact numbers throughout the school year.

ATTENDANCE

in the early grades

Many of our youngest students miss 10 percent of the school year—about 18 days a year or just two days every month. Chronic absenteeism in kindergarten, and even preK, can predict lower test scores, poor attendance and retention in later grades, especially if the problem persists for more than a year. Do you know how many young children are chronically absent in your school or community?

Who Is Affected

Kindergarten and 1st grade classes often have absenteeism rates as high as those in high school. Many of these absences are excused, but they still add up to lost time in the classroom.

In kindergarten and 1st grade are chronically absent. In some schools, it's as high as 1 in 4.¹

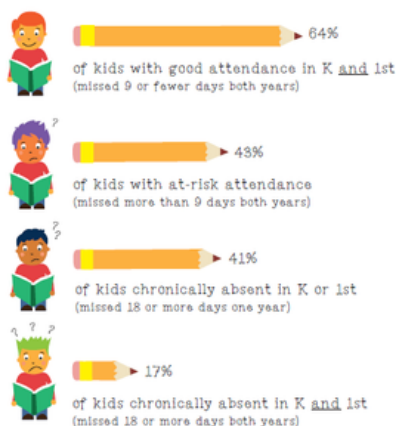

Why It Matters

If children don't show up for school regularly, they miss out on fundamental reading and math skills and the chance to build a habit of good attendance that will carry them into college and careers.

Preliminary data from a California study found that children who were chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade were far less likely to read proficiently at the end of 3rd grade.

What We Can Do



Engage Families

Many parents and students don't realize how quickly early absences can add up to academic trouble. Community members and teachers can educate families and build a culture of attendance through early outreach, incentives and attention to data.



Fix Transportation

The lack of a reliable car, or simply missing the school bus, can mean some students don't make it to class. Schools, transit agencies and community partners can organize car pools, supply bus passes or find other ways to get kids to school.



Address Health Needs

Health concerns, particularly asthma and dental problems, are among the leading reasons students miss school in the early grades. Schools and medical professionals can work together to give children and families health care and advice.



Track the Right Data

Schools too often overlook chronic absence because they track average attendance or unexcused absences, not how many kids miss too many days for any reason. Attendance Works has free data-tracking tools.
