Science: Students will develop a strong content understanding in the earth, life, and physical sciences as well as develop problem-solving and critical-thinking skills.



- Offer literacy workshops for parents to provide tools & strategies to support reading comprehension and fluency at home.
- Offer math workshops for parents to provide tools & strategies for understanding and solving word problems.
- Offer technology components at each family workshop to support reading fluency and comprehension and mathematical problem solving.



As Students, we will ...

- Practice reading skills and comprehension strategies, practice high frequency/sight words, and read daily to improve fluency and comprehension.
- Practice word problem solving strategies at home using resources learned by our parents in workshops and taught by our teachers in class.
- Practice reading comprehension and word problem solving strategies using online resources, including eCLASS, and other tools at home.

- Support literacy goals by reading nightly and attending parent workshops to learn reading comprehension and fluency strategies and high frequency/sight words and practice these with my child at home.
- Support math goals by attending parent workshops to learn math word problem solving strategies and games to use with my child at home.
- Utilize the Parent Portal and other online resources, including eCLASS, to support my child in reading and math at home.
