Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. • Long Term Goal

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in The Plan/The Promise.

Long Term Goal

The percentage of Baggett students scoring in the Proficient/Distinguished levels on the GMAS will be at or above 45% Language Arts subtests, 55% on the Math subtests, and 55% on the Science subtest, and 45% on the Social Studies subtest. Our students will leave Baggett Elementary with the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in middle school and be able to pursue the college and career of their choice.

o Annual Goal

MATHEMATICS: All Baggett Elementary School students will demonstrate increased achievement in Mathematics by accomplishing the following:

50.4% (3rd), 45.8% (4th). 49.7% (5th) of students who participate in the Math GMAS (Grades 3-5) will score in the proficient/distinguished levels in school year 2021-22.

o Annual Goal

SCIENCE: 51.4% of students who participate in the Science GMAS (grade 5) will score in the proficient/distinguished levels in school year 2021-22.

o Annual Goal

SOCIAL STUDIES: 52.1% of students who participate in the Social Studies District Assessments (DAs) will score in the proficient/distinguished levels in school year 2021-22.

Long Term Goal

The percentage of Baggett students reading on or above grade level as measured by the Fountas & Pinnell Inventory at the end of the year will be at or above 75% of K-2 students and 65% of 3-5 students.

o Annual Goal

ENGLISH/LANGUAGE ARTS: All Baggett Elementary School students will demonstrate increased achievement in ELA by accomplishing the following:

100% of students in grades K-5 will demonstrate improved reading ability in school year 2020-21. 90% of students in grades K-5 will demonstrate on grade level performance in reading or achieve one years growth in reading as measured by the BAS in school year 2020-21.

46.0% (3rd), 47.2% (4th), 49.3% (5th) of students who participate in the ELA GMAS (Grades 3-5) will score in the proficient/distinguished levels during school year 2021-22.

65% of our English Learners who participate in ACCESS will move from one performance band to a higher performance band as measured by the 2021 ACCESS during school year 2020-21.
