Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. Brookwood High School will increase ALL students' academic performance in Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies on all state and district assessments.

Brookwood High School will increase ALL students' academic performance and mastery in all subject areas by using unit assessments to measure students' mastery of AKS and tracking the results of school-wide remediation and reassessment efforts.

Long Term Goal

Brookwood High School will increase its 4-year cohort graduation rate to 96% by 2025-2026.

Brookwood High School will increase its 4-year graduation rate (including summer graduates) by 2% from 93.8 % to 95.8 % as measured by the cohort analyzer for the 2021-2022SY.
