Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. Long Term Goal

Students will have access to the maximum level of rigor where they can be prepared for success in post secondary work. Additionally, Move on When Ready participation, Advanced Placement course participation, and Maxwell High School Industry Certifications will increase by 15%.

o Annual Goal

College and Career Ready Students will have access to the maximum level of rigor where they can be prepared for success in post secondary work. Dual Enrollment participation, Advanced Placement course participation, Industry Certifications, and participation in Duluth Pathways, such as CTAE, Healthcare Science, Computer Science and Fine Arts will all increase by 15%.

Long Term Goal

Duluth High School will increase its graduation rate for all student subgroups.

o Annual Goal

Duluth High School will continue on its trajectory of increasing the percentage of our students who graduate by increasing to an 83% graduation rate for the 2022-2022 school year

Duluth High School will increase student achievement in the areas of Social Studies, Science, Language Arts, and Math for all students.

o Annual Goal

Duluth High School will increase academic performance for all students to meet and/or exceed the district and state average for each subgroup and subject area on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Duluth students' scale scores will be at or above the district average on the Gateway examination in Science and in Social Studies
