Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. Long Term Goal

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in The Plan/The Promise.

Long Term Goal

Jordan Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the "proficient" or "distinguished" range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/Language Arts and Mathematics to 100% in 2024-2025.

o Annual Goal

Jordan Middle School will increase student performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS) in both the End of Grade (EOG) and End of Course (EOC) in all assessed subject areas. Each assessed subject area will increase the number of students performing in the proficient and distinguished level as identified: 6th LA 46%, 7th LA 34 %, 8th LA 46%; 6th MA 34%, 7th MA 42%, 8th MA 47% and Algebra I 47%; 8th SS 41% and 8/9 Phy Sci 42%. For the non-GMAS subjects, we will increase student performance in the proficient and distinguished range on the district assessments as identified: 6th and 7th SS 41% and 6th and 7th SC 42% which is aligned with the EOG/EOC targets for these subjects.

o Annual Goal

Jordan Middle School's CCRPI score will be in the top 25% of Georgia middle schools in 2021-2022.

Long Term Goal

Jordan Middle School students will demonstrate mastery in mathematics and science with 100% of students scoring in the "proficient" or "distinguished" range on the Coordinate Algebra I and Physical Science EOC State Assessment in 2024-2025.

o Annual Goal

Jordan Middle School will have all of the students (100%) enrolled in Algebra I, Accelerated Algebra I, and 9th Grade Physical Science score in the developing, proficient, and distinguished range (Post 1 and Post 2). By May 2022, at least 47% of all the students enrolled will score in the proficient and distinguished range on the EOC Algebra I, and at least 42% of all the students enrolled will score in the proficient and distinguished range on the EOC Physical Science.
