# Local School Plan for Improvement Moore Middle School

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. ## Long Term Goal

Moore Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the "proficient" or "distinguished" range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/language arts, mathematics and 8th grade social studies to 100% in 2022-23.

Moore Middle School students will also demonstrate mastery in mathematics and science with 100% of students scoring in the "proficient" or "distinguished" range on the Coordinate Algebra I and Physical Science EOC State Assessment in 2022-2023.

#### o Annual Goal

Moore Middle School will increase student performance in the proficient and distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS) in the End of Grade (EOG) in English/language arts to 6th LA 39%, 7th LA 37%, 8th LA 43%.

Moore Middle School Language Arts students will by the end of the 2021-22 school year, increase the percentage of students scoring Grade Level or Above in Reading on the End of Grade assessment to 6th LA 80%, 7th LA 80%, 8th LA 84%.

Moore Middle School Language Arts students will score within six points of the GCPS average for percent Proficient/Distinguished on each of the quarterly district assessments.

#### o Annual Goal

Moore Middle School will increase student performance in the proficient and distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS) in the End of Grade (EOC) in Physical Science: HS Phy/SC 43%.

Moore Middle School Science students will score within six points of the GCPS average for percent Proficient/Distinguished on each of the quarterly district assessments.

#### o Annual Goal

Moore Middle School will increase student performance in the proficient and distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS) in the End of Grade (EOG) in social studies: 8th SS 45%.

Moore Middle School Social Studies students will score within six points of the GCPS average for percent Proficient/Distinguished on each of the quarterly district assessments.

#### o Annual Goal

Moore Middle School will increase student performance in the proficient and distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS) in both the End of Grade (EOG) and End of Course (EOC) in mathematics 6th MA 40%, 7th MA 44%, 8th MA and Algebra I 46%.

Moore Middle School Mathematics students will score within six points of the GCPS average for percent Proficient/Distinguished on each of the quarterly district assessments.
