Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. Long Term Goal

All Shiloh Middle School students will score in the proficient or distinguished range on the English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies End of Grade and End of Course Georgia Milestones Assessment, by Spring 2022.

o Annual Goal

Shiloh Middle School will increase the number of students scoring at the Proficient/Distinguished levels to 55% in all core content areas (LA, MA, SC, SS), as measured by local, district and/or state assessments for the 2021-2022 school year. Shiloh Middle School will increase the number of students scoring at the Distinguished level to at least 20%, as measured by local, district and/or state assessments for the 2021-2022 school year. If either of the assessments mentioned above are not available, identified assessments will be utilized to monitor progress towards the identified goal.

o Annual Goal

Shiloh Middle School will continue to build and promote a positive school culture by decreasing the number of discipline incidents by at least 5% and effectively implementing PBIS as a schoolwide initiative.

Long Term Goal

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in The Plan/The Promise.
