## Seven-Period Schedule

- Earn 7 Carnegie Units each year toward graduation
- 23 Credits required for graduation per state guidelines
- 28+ Credits earned at McClure Health Science High School
- Academic Levels Available for Courses:
  - College Preparatory
  - Honors/Gifted
  - Advanced Placement

## Carnegie Credits Earned in MS

- High School Credit Options available in our cluster Middle Schools:
  - Algebra I
  - Accelerated Algebra I
  - Physical Science
- You will receive a form at the end of the year
- The form must be returned to your middle school indicating your choice

## Carnegie Credits Earned in MS


- If a student accepts credit:
  - The grade shown on the high school transcript will be a "P" for pass
  - Courses that earn a high school Carnegie credit in middle school are not used in the GPA calculation for high school ranking or HOPE Scholarship
  - Both semester grades are used to determine credit earned
  - The course **CANNOT** be retaken if you accept the credit
  - McClure Health Science expects ALL STUDENTS to take 4 math classes in high school


## Carnegie Credits Earned in MS

## **Math Trajectory**







- During the first week of May, you will receive your student's tentative course list





# A Schoolwide Program

Schools operating schoolwide programs serve all students to improve student achievement. The schools do not have to identify particular children as eligible for services because all students enrolled are eligible to receive the services provided with Title 1 including direct instruction from staff paid with Title 1 funds.
