### What is Title I?

### The Title I Program:

- Is the largest federal assistance program for schools.
- > Provides support to students who are at risk of not meeting the State's academic standards.
- > Determines funding by the number of students receiving free or reduced lunch.
- Supports parents/families by offering activities and training opportunities to increase engagement in their children's education.

### What is Title I?

### Two types of Title I programs:

- > Targeted Assistance:
  - > No schools in GCPS participate in TA
- > Schoolwide:

78 schools participate in GCPS

### What is Title I?

### **Schoolwide Program**

- All students at the school benefit from Title I funds.
- Materials, equipment, technology, professional development, extended learning time, salaries of some teachers, and the Family Center are some of the possible items funded through Title I

- ▶ Use diagnostic and AKS assessments to analyze Tier I instruction's strengths and weaknesses and identify the level of support needed for all students.
- ▶ Use Synergy discipline data to analyze Tier I and Tier II behavioral data to identify strength and needs to develop lessons for schoolwide implementation.
- ▶ Provide professional development on Tier I and Tier II academic and social-emotional instruction.
- ▶ Provide teachers with resources to support Tier I, Tier II, and Tier III instruction

- ▶ Equity: 2. All students deserve equitable access to programs and activities that meet their academic, creative, and social-emotional needs, including enrichment, acceleration, computer science, athletic, visual, and performing arts
- ▶ Use diagnostic testing to identify student needs and the appropriate interventions and enrichment.
- ▶ Develop extended learning time activities that accelerate and enrich students.
- ▶ Increase opportunities for students to participate in enrichment activities and events like clubs and field trips.
- ▶ Provide professional development on effective teaching strategies for multilingual students to allow curriculum access at all English language proficiency levels.

- ▶ Effectiveness: 3. Setting goals encapsulating the growth and accomplishments of the whole child or staff member is essential for defining focus, developing new behaviors, and promoting lifelong learning. By targeting academic and behavioral data, staff can improve on what they do best, and students can develop motivation and purpose.
- ▶ Designate specific times and days for grade-level and vertical collaboration on student achievement data and develop team action steps, including whole group, small group, and individual instruction.
- ▶ Refine teacher teams' analysis of student academic and behavioral data to determine classroom and individual next steps.
- ► Implement classroom and student goal-setting to encourage growth and success.

- ▶ Excellence: 4. Communication is how we understand each other and build confidence and trust. World-class communication allows all stakeholders to work together.
- ▶ Send parent communication in preferred languages.
- ▶ Increase opportunities for parents to share their ideas and opinions.
- ▶ Promote parent participation in parent conferences, parent workshops, and Lunch and Learns.
- ▶ Use social media and communication applications to increase parent involvement.



These funds are used to partially pay for a parent support person and/or to fund family engagement activities at schools.



Teaching Positions: Salaries/Benefits	\$100,000	2 math teachers, 1 instuctional coach
