



About: Ivy Creek Crochet Club is a club designed for students in third, fourth, and fifth grade who want to learn how to crochet. Since the beginning stages of learning may require plenty of individual assistance, there is a limit of 12 students.

Club Fee: There is no fee for this club since members will bring their own materials.

Materials Needed: Members are asked to please bring a ball of yarn and crochet hook on the scheduled club dates.

When learning to crochet, children work best with:

- **crochet hook**-size *H* or above (a medium-to-large sized)
- **yarn**- weight 4 (worsted) or 5 (bulky)

It is best to choose large hooks with a comfortable grip and thicker yarn. Choosing a smooth yarn in a solid, light color is best since it can be difficult to see stitches that are formed with darker yarn or yarn with different colors.

Acrylic yarn fiber is best for beginners since this type of yarn is inexpensive and easy to work with. Initially, we will learn how to crochet using acrylic yarn. We may eventually use cotton yarn for projects that are used with heat such as potholders, hot pads/trivets, or oven mitts.
