About Gwinnett County Public Schools

Envisioning a system of world-class schools... The largest school system in the state and the 11th largest in the nation, Gwinnett County Public Schools (GCPS) is a diverse district in metro Atlanta, serving more than 180,000 students. The district has 25 high schools, including 20 cluster high schools, two theme schools, a STEM-focused school, an online school, and an open campus high school. Aligned to state-adopted Georgia Standards of Excellence and Georgia Performance Standards, GCPS' rigorous custom standards (known as the Academic Knowledge and Skills or AKS) is combined with exceptional teaching and meaningful testing to form a comprehensive instructional program. Highly qualified teachers, involved parents, and a supportive community are key elements in GCPS' quest to become a system of world-class schools preparing students for college, careers, and life in a globally competitive future.

Graduation and Testing Requirements for the Class of 2023

In order to earn a regular Gwinnett County high school diploma, students in the Class of 2023 must:

- Learn the AKS standards in order to pass classes and earn the required course credits/units (*see below*);
- Participate in state-mandated End of Course (EOC) assessments for designated courses in core areas.
- Subject to future Board action, the Class of 2023 will be required to pass Gwinnett's High School Gateway Writing Assessment in U.S. History. Due to the pandemic, the Gateway requirement in Science is waived.

To graduate, Georgia students must earn a minimum of 23 credits (also called units) in required areas of study. Students earn .5 units per class per quarter, with one full credit available per class each semester.

About Peachtree Ridge High School

Peachtree Ridge High School is located in Suwanee, Georgia and first opened its doors in August of 2003. Our vision is that PRHS will be the standard of excellence as a learning community, committed to effective instruction that prepares students for success in a dynamic global environment. As a STEM Gold School and three-time STEM Certified School, PRHS is recognized nationally for STEM education. In 2022, Peachtree Ridge was named an AP School of Distinction, AP Humanities School, AP Humanities Achievement School, AP STEM School, and AP STEM Achievement School. Additionally, US News & World Report consistently ranks PRHS as a high-performing high school, with a ranking of 32nd in the state in 2022. In 2021, Peachtree Ridge was named a GreatSchools College Success Award recipient for having a multiyear track record of preparing students for postsecondary success.

Block Schedule & Instructional Hours

The school operates on a block schedule where students take 4 courses each semester and earn 8 credits per year. There are two semesters of 18 weeks each for a total of 180 instructional days. Four classes meet daily. School calendar runs August to May. Beginning fall 2019, students earn .5 credit after each 9 weeks.

Class Rank/Numeric Average

On a GCPS transcript, class grades for each semester are presented in both a *weighted* and an *unweighted* format. GCPS adds an additional 10 points to the final grade for Advanced Placement (AP) courses, reflecting the rigor of the class. (No additional weight is given to gifted or honors coursework.) This *weighted* average is used in determining a student's class rank, including valedictorian and salutatorian, and in calculating the Weighted Numeric Average and the Weighted Grade Point Average (GPA). The GPA (5-point scale) is computed at the end of each semester, including all attempted high school courses. Honors graduates have earned a 90% or higher cumulative average that includes all attempted high school courses.

Curriculum Offerings

Advanced Placement (AP), Gifted, Honors, and College Preparatory classes are available in each academic area—language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, and modern/classical languages. The school also offers a full complement of classes in health and PE, the fine arts, and career and technical education. AP classes are college-level classes. Gifted classes are rigorous, exceeding grade-level norms. Honors classes are demanding, often exceeding grade-level norms. College prep classes reflect the grade-level norm. Technology permeates a GCPS education, and students develop key skills as critical thinkers, creative problem-solvers, and effective communicators.

Advanced Placement

Available college-level AP courses include English Literature, English Language, Statistics, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics C: Mechanics, Environmental Science, Human Geography, World History, U.S. History, U.S. Government, European History, Macroeconomics, Comparative Government, Psychology, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, French Language, Latin Literature, Chinese Language, Art History, Studio Art, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles, Seminar, and Research.

During 2021-2022, 999 students completed AP exams for a total of 1,939 exams taken. 69% received a 3 +.
