Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. Long Term Goal

K-5 students at Riverside Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in reading comprehension and writing. 100% of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will score in the "proficient" or "distinguished" range and at least 50% will score in the "distinguished" range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System in Language Arts by the 2020-21 school year.

o Annual Goal

At least 50% of students in grades 1 though 5 will show high growth as measured by the Language Arts pre and post Student Performance Goal (SPG) or District Assessment (DA).

Long Term Goal

K-5 students at Riverside Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in mathematical concepts. 100% of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will score in the "proficient" or "distinguished" range and at least 50% will score in the "distinguished" range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System in Mathematics by the 2020-21 school year.

o Annual Goal

At least 80% of students in grades 1 through 5 will show high growth as measured by the Mathematics pre and post Student Performance Goal (SPG) or District Assessment (DA).
