

Gwinnett Online Campus provides several online learning options for GCPS middle school students. In addition to the full-time program, GCPS students can participate in the supplemental and summer school programs. Students in all programs have access to their content anytime, anywhere 24/7 and all courses are taught by GCPS teachers.



The Full-Time program is open to all Gwinnett County residents throughout the year.

- Students take all 6 of their courses with GOC
- Students can participate in on-campus and social opportunities
- Families should come in-person to register
- All GCPS promotion requirements are maintained
- Course catalog includes all levels of language arts, math, science, and social studies as well as connections courses and several Carnegie options in 8th grade

The Summer School program is open to current GCPS 8th graders who wish to take high school courses before 9th grade.

- Students are only eligible to take the mandatory Personal
 Fitness course and/or the mandatory Health course
- All work is completed online away from the school
- Students must attend in-person final exam testing
- Pre-fitness testing for Personal Fitness can be completed at home
- Students must self-register on MyPayments Plus beginning in February; the cost for Summer School is \$250/course

The Supplemental program is open to current GCPS students who wish to take some of their classes online.

- Two supplemental options are available to students: FTE and Tuition
 - FTE students take 1-5 classes as a part of the regular school day and must be registered by the home school assistant principal; registration communication will be sent to local schools following Spring Break
 - Tuition students take extra courses for \$250/course and the student must self-register on MyPayments Plus beginning in July
- Supplemental students cannot participate in on-campus and social opportunities
- Available courses include all levels of language arts, math, science, and social studies as well as the following **Carnegie** option connections:
 - Spanish I
 - Spanish II
 - Marketing Principles
 - Introduction to Business Technology
 - Foundations of Engineering
- The following non-Carnegie CTAE courses are available to support the CS for All initiative:
 - Foundations of Computer Programming (6th grade)
 - Foundations of Secure Information Systems (7th grade)
 - Foundations of Interactive Design (8th grade)
