Compete the Mill Creek Dual Enrollment Contract and turn it into Mrs. Griffin.
Take the SAT/ACT/ACCUPLACER (if needed) before Mill Creek's &/or college
admission deadlines – request scores to be sent to colleges when registering for the test; don't
wait until scores are received. Send AP scores to the college as well to exempt intro level courses.
☐ Both Student and Parent/Guardian completes their portions of the Dual Enrollment Funding
Application on GAfutures.org; this is done once a year for each college the student attends. Make
sure you are using the 2024-2025 application — opens usually in February.
Apply and gain acceptance to the college you wish to attend for DE. Students are responsible for
following the college's application procedures and meeting all deadlines.
After receiving your acceptance to the college, schedule an appointment to meet with Mrs. Griffin
to plan your Mill Creek and college classes.
<ul> <li>Part-time Dual Enrollment students will need to plan all college classes around their Mill</li> </ul>
Creek schedule (course selections and times of their classes). Mill Creek schedule must be
finalized by May 8, 2024.
Part-time DE students will need to make all transportation arrangements for their college classes.
Parking passes are not guaranteed for DE students and DE students are unable to be on Mill Creek's
campus on days/class periods they do not have their college class(s). Students also are unable to
remain on MC's campus to complete their online classes as well. No Exceptions.
Register for classes at the college. Follow the college's procedure for registering for classes.
Turn in a copy of your college schedule to Mrs. Griffin.
Dual Enrollment Students are responsible for completing all high school graduation

Attend a Dual Enrollment (DF) Information Meeting or watch/review the DF Presentation on Mill

requirements to participate in the graduation ceremony.

The counselor's responsibility is to make sure students meet requirements to GRADUATE from high school. The student's/parent's or guardian's responsibility is to research what will transfer to which college/major (the counselor can help direct but can't speak for a college).



## Dual Enrollment College Options & Deadlines 🐠



ALL COLLEGE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS below are SUBJECT TO CHANGE! It is the student's/parent's or guardian's responsibility to verify college admission requirements.

Mill Creek's Dual Enrollment Deadlines: Fall 2024/Summer 2024 -Mill Creek's DE Contract due to MCHS & apply to the college by March 13, 2024: Spring 2025 – Mill Creek's DE Contract due to MCHS & apply to the college by October 30, 2024.

College deadlines could be earlier or later – but students must meet Mill Creek's deadline to participate regardless of colleges' deadlines.

Part-time Dual Enrollment students must select college courses around class times & courses they have selected to take at Mill Creek. Student's Mill Creek schedule must be finalized by May 8, 2024.

#### University of North Georgia: In-person Classes & Online Classes



- 11th & 12th Graders Only
- GPA 3.25 Core **PLUS** meet one of the testing standards below
- SAT: 530 EBRW and 480 Math OR
- ACT: 20 English or Reading and 18 Math OR
- ACCUPLACER: 243 Reading, 4 Writeplacer, and 266 Math **OR**
- PSAT: 480 EBRW & 440 Math (taken in 10<sup>th</sup> grade)

#### Georgia Gwinnett: In-person Classes & Some Online Classes



11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> Graders only

- GPA 3.25 Core
- **Test Optional for Admission**
- English & Math Courses must Meet Certain Test Requirements:
- ENGL 1101: SAT 480 EBRW; OR ACT 17 English or 17 Reaching; OR Accuplacer 237 & 4 WritePlacer
- MATH 1111: SAT 510 Math; OR ACT 20 Math; OR Accuplacer 266 Quantitative Reasoning, Alg., & Stats. (QAS)

- GPA 3.00 Core
- **Test Optional for Admission**

#### 10th Graders:

- GPA 3.00 Core Plus
- SAT: 480 EBRW and 440 Math | 1200 Combined OR ACT: 17 English or Reading and 17 Math | 26 Composite

### Gwinnett Tech: In-person Classes & Online Classes



11th & 12th Graders

- 2.6 Core for Degree Level Courses PLUS
- SAT/ACT, PSAT or ACCUPLACER Test Scores are Required
- 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> graders DE Funding covers core courses as well as CTAE courses

#### 10<sup>th</sup> graders

DE only covers fees for specific CTAE classes only
