





- ✓ Be mindful of the class times and locations (campus, e-campus, online, etc.)
- ✓ Keep up with the Academic Calendars

- ✓ Understand how funding works: No retake, up to 30 credit hours, maintain SAP, register only for approved courses (directory on GaFutures.org)
- ✓ Check your GTC student email daily

- ✓ Transcripts – GTC will provide unofficial transcripts to the high schools after grades post
- ✓ GTC can provide numerical grades to the high school by submitting the Numerical Grade Request Form

Dual Enrollment Funding


- ✓ 10th graders can only utilize funding for CTAE classes
 - A minimum SAT score of 1200 or minimum ACT composite score of 26 in a single national test administration for core classes
- ✓ 11th and 12th graders can utilize funding for core classes and/or CTAE classes
- ✓ up to 30 College Credit Hours of Dual Enrollment Funding (*Approved list under the course directory in GAFutures.org*)
- ✓ 100% of Tuition, Regular Fees, and Textbooks –
 - Lab fees and other program-specific fees are not covered by Dual Enrollment Funding.

ENGLISH 1101 & 1102

English 1101 (fall) and 1102 (spring) w/ Mrs. Clark



Dual Enrollment students can earn credit for their English 1101 (fall) and 1102 (spring) courses on campus from Gwinnett Technical College taught by Mrs. Clark.

ENGL 1101: Students practice various modes of writing, ranging from exposition to argumentation and persuasion. ENGL 1101 includes a review of standard grammatical and stylistic usage in proofreading and editing. An introduction to library resources lays the foundation for research. Topics include writing analysis and practice, revision, and research. Students write a research paper using library resources and using a formatting and documentation style appropriate to the purpose and audience.

ENGL 1102: This course emphasizes the student's ability to read literature analytically and meaningfully and to communicate clearly. Students analyze the form and content of literature in historical and philosophical contexts. Topics include reading and analysis of fiction/nonfiction, poetry, and drama; research, and writing about literature.

Should I take DE 1101/1102 here at Duluth?

The **ideal student** could be **CP or Honors** but needs to be **motivated and disciplined**.

Students will be graded on **3 essays (80%)** and **classwork (20%)** each semester.

The class is a **hybrid of online work and classroom discussion**. Students will **work independently**, but also have the **benefit of a teacher** available in person for help.

Students who **pass 1101** will earn a **full year of high school credit**. Then, students can choose whether to continue on with 1102.


If classes offered at Duluth don't fit in your schedule, you can still take them online through Gwinnett Tech or another college.

AP Language or AP Literature	Dual Enrollment 1101/1102
Interactive discussion, debate, and group work, as well as individual writing assignments.	Individually completed work except for occasional writing/editing workshops
Preparation for AP Exam, for <i>possible</i> college credit with an AP score of 3/5 or higher	College Credit earned with a grade of C or higher and guaranteed transfer credit
Preparation for college writing overall (even if the student doesn't pass the AP exam)	On site help with a Duluth teacher/Gwinnett Tech professor if you choose to take on our campus.
Added 10 points to GPA (however, some colleges do not add these points to their calculations)	One semester of college counts as a full year credit of high school, so more schedule availability/flexibility

- Dual Enrollment Admission Criteria For Spring 2024, Summer 2024, and Fall 2024
- By the first day of semester at GGC:
 - must be 16 years of age
 - must be an 11th or 12th grade student
- Be on-track for completing all high school graduation requirements
- Be on-track for completing the USG's Required High School Curriculum (RHSC)
- Have a 3.25 High School GPA as calculated by GGC Admissions on the RHSC courses completed
- Meet GSFC's Dual Enrollment funding Program eligibility (details on GAFutures site: gafutures.org)

- Test Scores (Not required for admission to DE but can be submitted)

- Test Scores

- English

- SAT Evidence Based Reading and Writing: 500
 - ACT English or Reading: 21
 - Accuplacer Write Placer: 4 and Reading Comprehension: 237

- **OR**

- Math

- SAT Math: 510
 - ACT Math: 20
 - Accuplacer Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics: 266

- Students who do not attend a regionally accredited high school or home school program are required to submit a Home School Portfolio.

Next Steps

How do I apply?

1. Create Grizzly Profile to Apply Online, Dual Enrollment Students are exempted from application fee- watch for a pop-up in your browser window
2. Review Admission Requirements
3. Submit Document Requirements
4. Meet with your high school counselor so they can begin the approval process on the high school side.

Application Deadlines: (please check GGC website for updates)

- Fall Semester – May 2
- Spring Semester – December 1
- Summer Semester – April 1

Make a GA Futures Account

- Both Student and Parent/Guardian completes their portions in GA Futures

Apply to the college you wish to attend for DE

- Send your Test Scores, if needed
- Send your transcript to the college you wish to attend for DE; this can be done through GA Futures

Schedule an appointment on eClass to meet with your assigned counselor to plan your Duluth and college classes.

- After receiving your acceptance to the college

Submit your Dual Enrollment Contract via Google Form

Register for classes at the college

- Submit screenshot of your college DE schedule through the Google Form
- Students are unable to drop dual enrollment courses after the beginning of the semester. Colleges will advertise additional drop days

DHS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES



**DHS DEADLINE:
March 29, 2024**

Part Time

- Combination of classes at Duluth and the college of your choice
- Duluth's & the college's calendar don't always align. Professors may not excuse absences due to state play-offs, family spring break, etc. Must earn 3 credits a semester, at a minimum
 - 1 DHS Class earns .5 credit per semester
 - 1 DE Class earns 1 credit per semester

1 DE	5 DHS
2 DE	4 DHS
3 DE	3 DHS

Full Time

- Attend class at the college full-time
- No classes at DHS – minimum of 4 classes at the college
- Still considered a Duluth High School Student

Important to Note

- Colleges communicate with the student – not the parent/guardian or with DHS staff
- Credit transferability is not guaranteed
