## Images: Alternative Text and Infographics

**Alternative Text:** Replaces images with text for assistive devices.

- Character Length
  - o Website: No more than 125 characters.
  - Documents and Presentations: No more than 250 characters as that is the maximum most assistive devices will read.
- If the image includes text, the text should be included in the alternative text. Images with more text than 125 characters may need to be treated as an infographic.

Okay alt text: pancakes


Better alt text: stack of pancakes

Best alt text: Stack of blueberry pancakes with powdered sugar

**Infographic:** A visual representation of information.

- Alternative Text describes what the image is and where its fully described.
- Image infographics are a popular infographic format.
   This format is also the least accessible. A screen reader cannot recognize the content (text) within an image. An image Infographic requires an alternative description in the form of a transcript which communicates the same information as the infographic image.
  - o Website: Link to a transcript
  - Website or Files: Provide the transcript text in the file content.
