| CTAE/Fine Arts/Foreign Language | 3 credits |
| Physical/Health Education | 1 credits |

| TOTAL CREDITS: | 23 |

^{*2} Years of the same foreign language is required for admission to all 4 yr and some 2 yr colleges.

^{**3} years of JROTC can cover the Health/PE requirement

- ✗ If you fail a class, it remains on your transcript!

WHAT IF I FAIL A CLASS?

Course Recovery Options

- X Credit Recovery (Not for athletes pursuing NCAA clearinghouse registration)
- ✗ Gwinnett Online Campus Supplemental Courses
- Phoenix 7th Hour Classes (mini-mesters)
- X Summer School

*It is important for students to begin course recovery as soon as possible, do not wait until senior year to begin truing to make up credits!

*Students who plan to take a course outside of Gwinnett County Public Schools (GCPS) must meet with their counselor first! The Office of School Improvement and Operations must approve ALL credit awarded to GCPS students for courses taken outside of GCPS. In addition, GCPS students who are seeking credit from a private school must take and pass the End of Course (EOC) assessments regardless of the private school's accreditation status.


REMEMBER! DON'T FORGET! TAKE A PICTURE!

KEEPING UP WITH SOCIAL ACTIVITIES - SEXTING AND SOCIAL MEDIA

- Sending/receiving sexually explicit photos/messages via cell phone/internet
 - x 39% of teens have sent a text
 - X 48% of teens have received a sext
 - 22% of females and 18% of males have sexted semi-nude/nude photos of themselves
- X Legal Issue
 - X Teens caught sexting can be charged with production, distribution, or possessing pornagraphy
- Colleges and employers are using social media to recruit and research candidates!
- X There is no such thing as a delete button!!!! Think before you post!
- X Cyberbullying



- Signs Look for Extremes (unusual) and Persistence (continuous)
 - X Sadness, hopelessness
 - X Anger, Hostility
 - X Poor school performance, loss of interest in activities
 - X Thoughts of death or suicide
- What to Do
 - X Don't ignore the problem ask and acknowledge
 - X Connect with your teen volunteer, hang out
 - X Physical health get moving, limit screen time
 - X Talk to physician or community counselor if necessary
