Georgia Legislation Highlights

- 3. Georgia PTA bills on the radar
 - a. Hope/Zell Miller scholarships
 - i. HB <u>HB 87</u> will provide HOPE grant eligibility for students seeking an associate degree at a branch of the Technical College System of Georgia. It also includes remedial and developmental courses required for such degree.
 - ii. <u>HB 89</u> will provide students who do not qualify for the Zell Mill Scholarship freshman year a path to the scholarship.
 - iii. <u>HB 283</u> Zell Miller Scholarship will remove the SAT and ACT requirements for students who graduate from eligible high schools.
 - b. Attendance
 - i. <u>HB155</u> and <u>SB 3</u> raise the compulsory school attendance age to
 - ii. <u>HB 262</u> will lower the compulsory school attendance age to 4 calling for mandatory Pre-K. Currently, Georgia's children are required to attend school between their 6th and 16th birthdays.
 - c. Elementary school:
 - i. SB 110 would prohibit homework in grades K-2
 - ii. SB 122 the mandatory Recess Bill would require 30 minutes of recess in grades K-8
 - d. Georgia PTA opposes private school vouchers and urges its members to contact their legislators to vote "No" on HB 60, HB 142, and SB 47
