CLINIC MEDICATION PICK UP





GRADUATION REMINDERS

Graduation Practice: Students should arrive for graduation practice on May 22nd at 8:30 am (same day as ceremony). Attendance at graduation practice is mandatory for students to participate in the graduation ceremony. Students must make arrangements to attend practice and be present for the entire practice, in order to receive tickets for the graduation ceremony. Students should dress casually for practice (no cap and gown). The graduation dress code does not need to be followed at practice.

- If any emergency arises to prevent a student from attending practice, contact Ms. Gross immediately in room B213 or @ jody.gross@gcpsk12.org.
- Students who do not practice will not march AND will not receive tickets.

**Seniors will take their last 2 finals early, so the last day of school will be open for graduation practice in the morning with graduation that night.

Graduation Ceremony: Graduation is May 22nd at 8:00pm on Markham Field at Mill Creek Community Stadium. Each senior will receive 12 tickets. These will be distributed at graduation practice. For the ceremony, students will need to report to the Mill Creek Commons by 6:00pm. As we communicated at the meeting in the fall, you are strongly discouraged from scheduling your students appointments or events on the day of graduation.

Reminders about tickets: As stated above, each senior gets 12 tickers. Eight of these will be a gold color and four will be blue. Both colors can be used, if the ceremony is held in the stadium. If the ceremony has to be moved indoors for any reason, ONLY the blue tickets can be used. No gold tickets will be allowed for an indoor event, so the blue tickets should be given to guests with highest priority for attendance. Moving the ceremony indoors will be the absolute last resort and we will make every effort to have the ceremony on Wednesday May 22nd in the stadium. We will communicate any necessary changes as needed, but hope it will not be necessary. Please see the video from the parent meeting in November when Mr. Lane discussed protocol regarding possible inclement weather.

Ceremony Make-up Options: We will make EVERY effort to have the ceremony at the scheduled time and in the stadium. If necessary, however, here are the possible changes in the order in which they would be attempted:

- 1) Thursday Morning in the stadium
- 2) Thursday Evening in the stadium
- 3) Friday Morning (in the gym and only the 4 blue tickets would be allowed)
- **Communication about ceremony start and report times will be communicated as needed.



GRADUATION REMINDERS (*Continued*)

Please remind all guests in your party about the following:



• The following are **not allowed** into the ceremony: noisemakers, coolers, balloons, pets (unless you have paperwork designating it as a service animal), fatheads, or anything else that could block or impede other guests from viewing or hearing the ceremony.

• Our Clear Bag policy will be enforced. Detailed information is linked HERE.

Graduation Ceremony Parking: Campus parking will open at 4:00pm. You will **NOT** be allowed to park on campus before this time. Gates will open at 6:00PM. Due to the amount of people on campus for the ceremony, seniors are NOT allowed to park on campus for the ceremony, but they can ride with guests or be dropped off at the front of the school. Campus parking will be reserved for guests and school employees only.


Students who are driving themselves should park at **12 Stone Church located at 3858 Braselton Hwy, Buford, GA 30519**. Charter bus shuttles will transport students from the church parking lot to the school starting at 5:00pm. The shuttle services will continue after the ceremony until approximately 11:00pm.

Graduation Dress Code for Students: Specifics regarding dress code can be found here. Dress code will be enforced, so please be sure to familiarize yourself with the policy to avoid any issues on the day of the ceremony. Student

Electronic Device Policy: Students are **NOT allowed to have their cell phones** or any electronic devices once they report back for the ceremony the evening of graduation. This helps us maintain an efficient and nice ceremony for all involved. If students have a phone or device, these will be collected and can be picked up after the ceremony. *Please discuss with your guests and senior where you should meet after the ceremony prior to graduation day.*

Textbook, Chromebook, Library, and other potential fees: **ALL fees** must be paid, in order for a student to participate in the ceremony and to receive a diploma. Please be sure to check StudentVue to ensure that all fees have been paid, if applicable, before graduation day. This will keep you from any potential further delays on graduation day.

ACADEMICS MEET COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our anatomy classes are wrapping up a year-long project by serving those in need! As part of the project classes held a drive for baby essentials which produced some amazing results!

This was the culmination of a 40-week "pregnancy project" where students have followed a "pregnancy" in real time since the beginning of school. Each week the students have been entering information into a "pregnancy journal" all year about the development of the growing embryo/fetus/baby as well as tracking the mother's progress and symptoms

Each class "got pregnant" the first week of school, found out the gender of the baby at week 14 (Ms Sawyer's class had a Girl, Mr. Harbin's class had a Boy) - picked out names in a round-robin elimination style game and covered all milestones of pregnancy throughout the year. They are ending our journal back where they started with a study of the reproductive system and how fertilization happens at the cellular level.

Next week is our week 40 and the project is officially "full term."

All the donations were taken by Noor Family Services in Suwanee to be distributed to both The Drake House which helps give homes to homeless women and victims of domestic abuse and local DFCS offices.

In total, the classes donated 2000+ diapers! Also included were baby wipes, baby shampoo, baby powder, clothing, toys, blankets, and various toiletries for both mother and baby (toothpaste, deodorant, mouthwash, etc.)

In addition to special awards and scholarships, seniors with at least a 90 average at the end of 1st semester will be recognized as Honor Graduates.




SUMMER CREDIT RECOVERY

EPIC 9TH GRADE





MEDICAID UNWINDING

ATTENTION: Medicaid Members

Based on changes in the federal law, the State of Georgia began the Medicaid redetermination process in April 2023, and completion is expected by May 31, 2024. Every member was assigned a renewal month and deadline for completion. This process is to review an existing members continued eligibility for Medicaid, including Peachcare for kids. **EVERY GEORGIA MEDICAID MEMBER MUST RESPOND TO**

REQUEST FOR REQUIRED INFORMATION.

If you have not already gone through this process, log in to your Gateway account at <u>www.gateway.ga.gov</u> to make sure your Medicaid Contact Information is correct and check the month for your redetermination.

Need help? Visit your local Division of Family & Children Services office for support. To find the location and business hours for your local office visit: <u>www.dfcs.georgia.gov/locations</u>

If you need help reading this information or communicating with DFCS call 1-877-423-4746. Our services, including interpreters, are free. If you are deaf, hard of hearing, deafblind, or have difficulty speaking, you can call us at the number above by dialing 711 (Georgia Relay).

If you are no longer eligible for Medicaid, you will be referred to the Federally Facilitated Marketplace for alternative coverage options. If you feel the denial decision was an error, you can appeal the decision by requesting a Fair Hearing within 30 days from the date of denial and potentially get your coverage retroactively reinstated.



IMMUNIZATION REMINDER

Georgia law requires children attending a school or childcare facility be protected from certain vaccine-preventable diseases. All students entering or transferring into 11th grade will need proof that they received a meningococcal booster vaccine (MCV4) <u>on</u> or after their 16th birthday.

Immunizations certificates marked with an expiration date must be replaced no later than 30 days after the date of expiration.

- MCV4 vaccines must be documented on Georgia Form 3231 Certificate of Immunization.
- Students who are not 16 years old do not have to get the vaccine until their 16th birthday.
- Note that this booster vaccine is required in addition to the MCV4 vaccine that was required for your child prior to his or her beginning 7th grade.

Please make sure your student's immunizations are up to date. We MUST have a current GEORGIA Certificate of Immunization (Form #3231) on file for each student enrolled at Mill Creek OR a notarized statement of religious exemption (Form #2208). A medical exemption, if applicable, should be noted on Form #3231 with a current date of expiration. We will be conducting an audit of our students and failure to comply can result in 2024-2025 fall schedules being held or withdrawn.
